


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## *Factors That Determine Type of Output Student Will Receive*

- Type of FAFSA submitted
- E-mail address provided or not
- All required signatures received or not
- Applicant successfully matched with the Social Security Administration or not
- Student previously received PIN from ED or not





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# *Types of Financial Aid Applications*

- Student-centered applications – Forms students use to apply for federal student aid
  - The Paper FAFSA and Renewal FAFSA
  - FAFSA on the Web (FOTW) and Renewal FOTW
- School-centered applications – Forms schools use to apply for aid on student's behalf
  - EDExpress
  - FAA Access to CPS Online


