US Occupational Classification Systems

- Standard Occupational Classification System
 - 840 detailed occupations
- Occupational Information Network (O*NET)
 - 965 detailed occupations
 - Identifies new and emerging specialties
 - Associated job titles (lay titles)

SOC

- Used by Federal agencies that collect data on occupations
 - Bureau of Labor Statistics
 - Annual wage and salary data
 - Annual employment estimates
 - Projected employment for ten years out (updated every two years)
 - Census Bureau
 - Demographics



O*NET System

- Based on the 2000 SOC
 - (will move to 2010 SOC when published employment and wage data become available 2011-2012)
- Provides additional requirements and characteristics:
 - Tasks
 - Knowledge, skills, abilities
 - Work context
 - Interests

Tasks

- Administer prescribed medications or start intravenous fluids, and note times and amounts on patients' charts.
- Observe patients, charting and reporting changes in patients' conditions, such as adverse reactions to medication or treatment, and taking any necessary action.
- Provide basic patient care and treatments, such as taking temperatures or blood pressures, dressing wounds, treating bedsores, giving enemas or douches, rubbing with alcohol, massaging, or performing catheterizations.
- Sterilize equipment and supplies, using germicides, sterilizer, or autoclave.
- Answer patients' calls and determine how to assist them.
- Measure and record patients' vital signs, such as height, weight, temperature, blood pressure, pulse and respiration.
