#### **Issue Alert for EDEXpress 2008-2009, Release 3.0 (07/22/08)**

Federal Student Aid has identified an issue with the recently posted EDEXpress 2008-2009, Release 3.0, that impacts the display of available CRWB09OP and CRAT09OP Import files on the Pell Grant, Direct Loan, and TEACH Grant import dialog boxes.

This issue only impacts users who run a Custom installation of Release 3.0 (for example, to upgrade from Release 2.0 to Release 3.0).

#### **Computer-Based Training Program for COD System Web Site, COD Reports, and Electronic MPN Web site (07/25/08)**

Federal Student Aid takes this opportunity to remind schools of the availability of an updated Computer-Based Training (CBT) for the [COD System Web site](#). The updated COD CBT includes enhancements that have been made to the COD System from March 2004 through April 14, 2007. Additionally, a new Direct Loan Reports CBT, a new Grant Reports CBT, and new simulations of the [Direct Loan Electronic Master Promissory Note \(MPN\) Web site](#) have been developed and are available for download.

The electronic files for the CBTs and simulations, as well as instructions for downloading and using these files, are available on the Information for Financial Aid Professionals (IFAP) Web site. Under the "Tools for Schools" section, click on [COD Computer-Based Training](#).

The CBTs and simulations are as follows:

#### ***COD System Web Site CBT***

The COD System Web site CBT simulates the COD System and functionality available to a school administrator. In the updated COD System Web site CBT, there are eight lessons with text and an open format to guide a user through each area of the COD System Web site simulation. The user can explore basic navigation and functions of the COD Web site and practice locating and creating information in a safe environment with tips for assistance.



## ***Grant Reports CBT***

The Grant Reports CBT offers three lessons that explain the COD reports a school can use to assist with the reconciliation process for Federal Pell Grant (Pell Grant), Academic Competitiveness Grant (ACG), and National Science and Mathematics Access to Retain Talent Grant (National SMART Grant) awards.

## ***Direct Loan Reports CBT***

The Direct Loan Reports CBT offers three lessons that explain the COD reports a school can use to assist with the reconciliation process for William D. Ford Federal Direct Loan (Direct Loan) awards.

## ***EMPN Online Simulations***

The EMPN Online Simulations serve as a guide for understanding the Direct Loan Electronic MPN Web site. The four simulations are as follows:

*ACG, National SMART Grant, Pell Grant, and TEACH Grant*

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#### **E-mail Outreach Regarding ACG And National SMART Grant Participation (07/15/08)**

On July 15, 2008, Federal Student Aid communicated via e-mail to Financial Aid Administrators at approximately 400 schools that had not yet submitted origination and disbursement records reflecting participation in the Academic Competitiveness Grant (ACG) Program and/or the National Science and Mathematics Access to Retain Talent Grant (National SMART Grant) Program for the 2006-2007 and 2007-2008 award years. These e-mails were disseminated by the COD School Relations Center ([CODSupport@acs-inc.com](mailto:CODSupport@acs-inc.com)) on behalf of William Leith, Acting General Manager of Federal Student Aid's Application, Operations and Delivery Services.

Federal Student Aid has asked each affected school to review its records and processes regarding compliance with the ACG Program and/or National SMART Grant Program regulations and then complete and return a certification for one program or both programs, as applicable. The certifications are to be mailed or faxed to the COD School Relations Center by July 25, 2008.

#### **TEACH Grant Operational Implementation Guidance – COD System Implementation and Guidance Summary (07/01/08)**

The College Cost Reduction and Access Act (the CCRAA), Pub. L. 110-84, authorized the Teacher Education Assistance for College and Higher Education (TEACH) Grant Program for implementation beginning with the 2008-2009 Award Year. The TEACH Grant Program provides up to \$4,000 a year in grant assistance to a student who agrees to serve for at least four years as a full-time teacher in a high-need field in a public or private elementary or secondary school that serves students from low-income families. A TEACH Grant recipient who does not



complete the required teaching within a specified timeframe, or fails to meet certain other requirements of the TEACH Grant Program, will be required to repay the TEACH Grant as a Direct Unsubsidized Loan under the William D. Ford Federal Direct Loan Program.

During the period June 27-28, 2008, Federal Student Aid implemented COD System functionality that supports the processing of TEACH Grant awards for the 2008-2009 and subsequent award years. This functionality included implementation of the [TEACH Grant Agreement to Serve \(ATS\) Web site](#).
